Ohio Marijuana Card Opens Doctors Office in Dayton

Gem City Gets a New State-Certified Medical Marijuana Doctor

Dayton, OH (August 20, 2018) — Ohio Marijuana Card planted its roots deeper into Ohio’s soil this week as they officially opened their latest doctor’s office in Dayton, Ohio. The new office joins Ohio Marijuana Card’s Akron, Cleveland, Columbus, Cincinnati and Toledo offices, which opened earlier this summer.

“We are pleased to announce that we have arrived in Gem City,” Ohio Marijuana Card President Connor Shore stated. “It is our mission to help patients easily obtain their medical marijuana card, and we are so happy to be able to open our offices here in Dayton.”

In September 2016, medical marijuana became legal in Ohio. Since that time, there have been several delays in the program. However, that’s soon to change as cultivators are currently planting marijuana and dispensaries are opening soon. That’s why Ohio Marijuana Card and its team of doctors have been hard at work getting patients their recommendations for medical marijuana — a requirement before obtaining a medical marijuana card in Ohio.

To receive a marijuana card in the state, patients must have one of the following qualifying medical conditions: chronic pain, post-traumatic stress disorder, cancer, glaucoma, fibromyalgia, Crohn’s disease, intractable pain, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), epilepsy (and other seizure disorders), hepatitis C, AIDS and HIV, chronic traumatic encephalopathy, Alzheimer’s disease, inflammatory bowel disease, Parkinson’s disease, multiple sclerosis, spinal cord disease or injury, ulcerative colitis, traumatic brain injury, sickle cell anemia, and Tourette syndrome.

Once a patient has determined that they qualify for medical marijuana, they must visit a state-certified medical marijuana doctor. This doctor examines the patient’s previous medical records and performs a brief non-invasive examination. Afterward, if the doctor determines

you qualify for medical marijuana, they will write a recommendation. This recommendation is sent off to the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy. After receiving your recommendation, the Board of Pharmacy issues a medical marijuana card to the patient.

Ohio Marijuana Card simplifies this process, providing a one-stop shop for patients hoping to receive their medical marijuana card without all the hassle. Their Dayton doctor is currently accepting new patients and booking fast.

“With six dispensaries opening in the Dayton area alone,” Shore added, “there is going to be a high demand for medical marijuana cards. We felt it was paramount to open a Dayton office so that patients would be able to get their marijuana cards quickly, and without breaking the bank.”

Ohio Marijuana Card has offices all across the state, in every major city. They offer easy one-time payments and monthly installment plans depending on the patient’s budget, as well as discounts for veterans and referrals. Their goal is to make sure everyone who is qualified for a medical marijuana card is able to obtain one without unwanted confusion.
